In addition to making recommendations for further advances at national and international levels, this volume identifies recent advances in human rights and public policy positions in relation to persons with intellectual disabilities. It also explores the implications of altering the status quo, and offers policy-makers and professionals ways to learn from each other's innovations in protecting rights, implementing quality assurance measures, and applying the concepts of inclusion and the 'least restrictive environment'.
